

# Velvet Owl Pouch Masters

(Non Embroidered, embroidery masters are attached)

## Materials Needed:

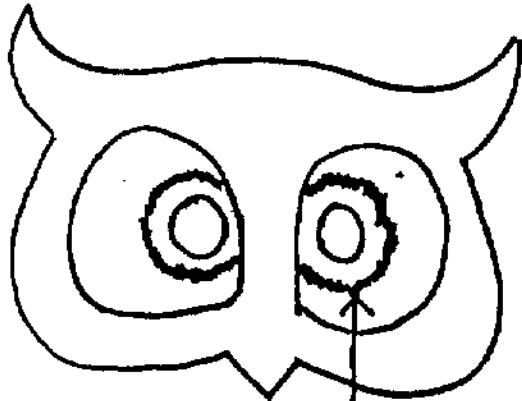
- White trigger, white thread
- Dark blue velvet (shell)
- Dark blue cotton or cotton/poly blend (lining)
- Blue thread
- Stitch Witchery/Wonder Under (or similar fusible applique)
- Manilla folder (to give pattern to, for a more permanent pattern)
- Big envelope

## Instructions

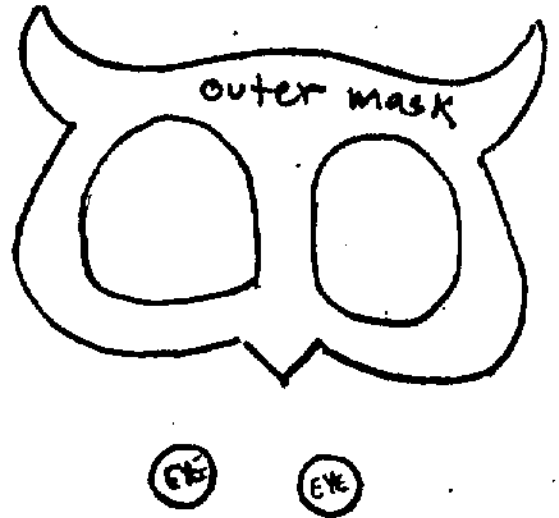
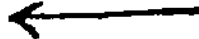
1. Glue pattern pieces for Owl Face, Back & Flap, Front, Sides, and Hanging Loops onto manila folder. Let dry, then cut out pieces. Don't lose owl eyeballs.
2. Cut owl face and eyeballs out of White fabric. (Pin to fabric & cut, or trace around pattern with pencil)
3. Cut Back & flap, front, and sides out of velvet.
4. Cut another Back & flap, front, sides, and hanging loops (2) from lining. NOTE\* Velvet is not sturdy enough for loops that last. We suggest a sturdier material such as trigger.
5. Iron and applique owl face onto front flap of outer pouch (see picture). Don't forget eyeballs.
6. Sew each hanging loop to back of pouch in indicated area. Attach firmly.
7. Attach sides to front with pins, then sew (1/2" seam allowance).
8. Attach unit from #7 above to back & flap. The outer shell of pouch is done.
9. Repeat #7 and #8 but for lining units. You'll have a lining without loops, and an outer shell with loops.
10. Line the pouch so that the raw edges are not visible. Top stitch around edge of pouch opening and flap.
11. Voila! A finished OVO pouch.

Hanging straps (cut 2): 2" x 7"  
Pouch sides/bottom (cut 1): 3" x 18"

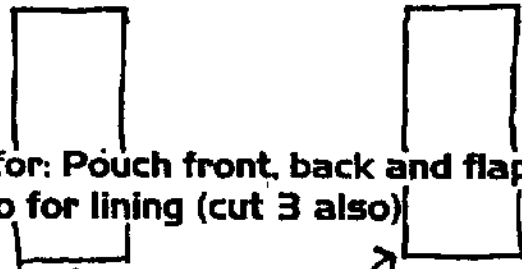


When applique'd  
looks like this



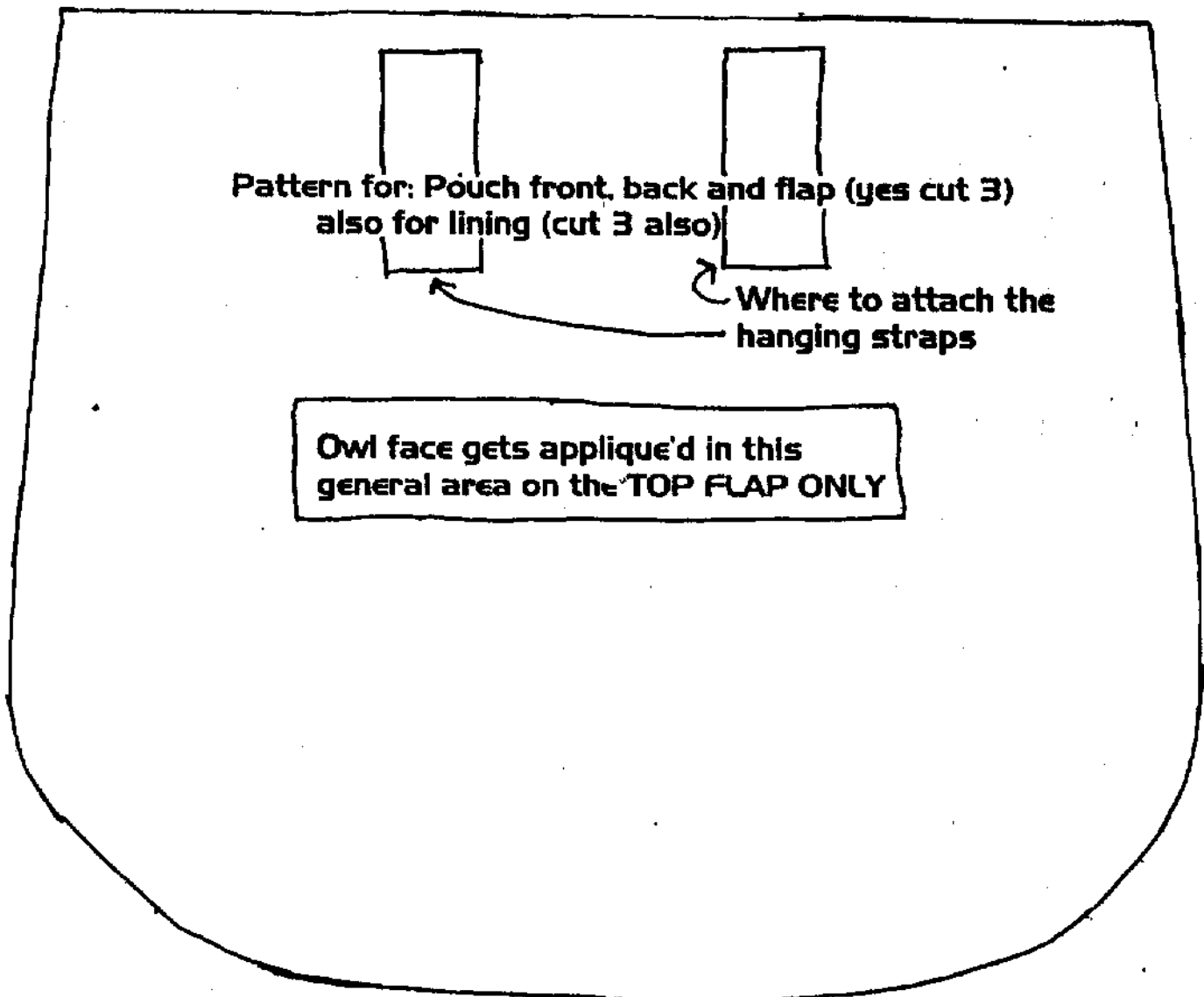
Fuzzy line narrow = zigzag to outline eyes

## Pattern for the Order of the Velvet Owl Pouch

Use three (3) strands of white embroidery floss

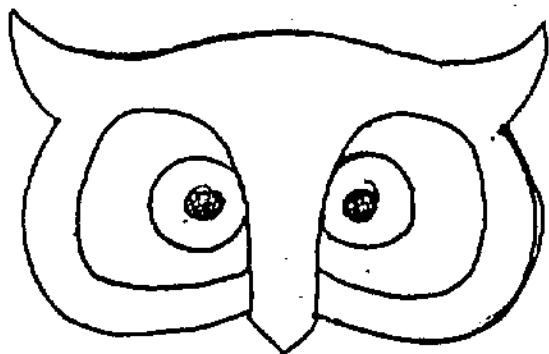
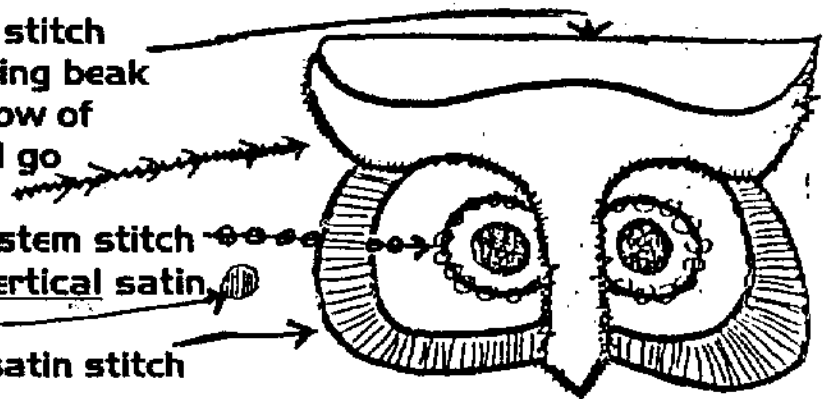
Outline top of mask with split stitch

Outline beak and lines connecting beak with top of mask in a double row of split stitch (all stitches should go in the same direction)

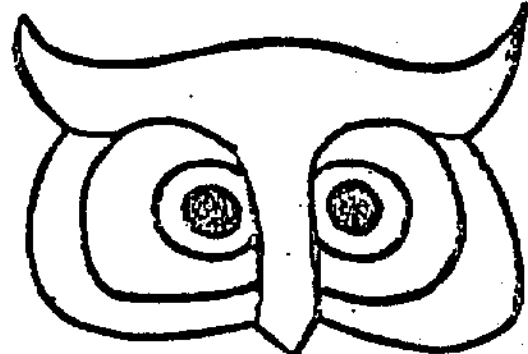
Outline circles around eyes in stem stitch

Work pupil of each eye with vertical satin stitch

Work outer sides of mask in satin stitch

The owl mask goes in approximately this general area. Use either the symetrical or the asymetrical mask; whichever you prefer is fine. (The asymetrical figure seems to be the more popularly used lately).
